Homer Laughlin China will showcase Fiesta dinnerware in its latest hue, Paprika, the 14th color in the Fiesta spectrum. With the introduction of Paprika, Evergreen will retire March 31 and Cinnabar will retire June 1. Paprika Fiesta has a suggested retail price of \$48 for a four or five-piece place setting. Paprika will also be available in square three-piece place settings for \$40. In addition to place settings, the Fiesta line includes a variety of plates, platters, bowls, cups, vases, the signature disc pitcher and a wide range of serving pieces.

Lenox

New under Dansk will be its Classic Fjord Lavender pattern. The flowering grass-like qualities of Lavender is said to create a fresh, natural feeling of well-being, according to the company. The pattern is presented on

the classic Fjord shape, which was first inspired by the boat-shaped bowls that Dansk produced in staved teakwood during the company's early years.

Lenox Simply Fine Watercolors dinnerware is said to combine the artistry of painted florals with geometric backgrounds; in new coupe shapes, the colorful florals are a rich

contrast to subtle gray backdrops, according to the company. Crafted of fine bone china, Watercolors is safe to use in the freezer, microwave, oven and dishwasher. It is available in Watercolor Indigo Blue, Watercolor Amethyst and Watercolor Citrus. It is sold in four-piece plate settings and has an MSRP of \$143. Also new under Lenox

will be its Garden crystal vases featuring seven clear shapes in graduated heights that allow the consumer to create a unique tablescape, according to the company.

Pasabahce

Pasabahce will be featuring its After Hours barware sets under its Denizli brand for the

"\$50 and under" retail category, which the company anticipates should be very strong for third and fourth quarter. Included in this effort is Denizli's five-piece Bailey Cocktail serving set and its Tremolo Crystal wine serving set, both with a suggested retail of \$50.

Robinson Home Products

Robinson Home Products will introduce a variety of new tabletop product in both the flatware and dinnerware categories under the Oneida brand. Two new 18/0 stainless steel flatware patterns from Oneida include Bonsai, which has updated bamboo styling with a modern appeal and a mirror finish. Oneida's Contra features a distinctive dual finished handle and a mirror and bead blast finish.
